Open Public Forum – Richard Hord asked for an update on the overcrowding situation at the jail, if expansion is being considered and if the former Hab Center has been considered. They were joined by elected officials from St. Clairsville and Richland Township and Scott Hicks, Director of Belomar Regional Council. "On behalf of the board, I would like to publicly thank all involved," said Mr. Thomas. He also thanked Belomar for their \$1 million commitment for Phase 2. Mr. Thomas noted Lloyd MacAdams, ODOT Deputy Director of District 11, gave an overview of the projects and growth in Belmont County and the increased traffic flow. He explained the importance of the road for safety purposes and ease of traffic flow. Dennis Bigler, Chairman of the County Transportation Improvement District, also gave an overview of the entire area and the completed Phase 1 road. "Showing the TRAC that completed road, the current development on both sides of Interstate 70 and the future development went a long, long way with TRAC," said Mr. Thomas. We should know in two months if we are receiving the funding. Mr. Coffland said, "At that presentation, no one has the story Belmont County has. Nowhere in the state has the story that we took. What this means for this whole region and this whole state will be unbelievable." Mrs. Favede said, "We all left feeling very confident that this will take place and that within a year to two years we'll have that connector road. We are very excited about the future."
