WHEREAS, on or about the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September, 2019, Belmont County, Ohio, received a notice from the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, advising Belmont County officials how the County's rights are affected by a Negotiation Class seeking to settle claims against manufacturers, distributors, and retailers of prescription opiate drugs for monies spent addressing the opioid crisis; and

WHEREAS, If a potential Class Member intends to opt-out of the class certified in *In re National Prescription Opiate Litigation*, MDL 2804, an Exclusion Request Form must be returned either by email to <a href="mailto:info@OpioidsNegotiationClass.info">info@OpioidsNegotiationClass.info</a> or by first class mail to NPO Litigation, P.O. Box 6727 Portland, OR 97228-6727, no later than November 22, 2019; and

WHEREAS, it is not necessary to complete the Exclusion Request Form if Belmont County, Ohio, wants to remain a Class Member and wants to share in any potential negotiated Class Settlement; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Belmont County, Ohio, Board of Commissioners, to remain a member in the proposed Negotiation Class and to share in any potential negotiated Class settlement.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

Section 1: No official or employee of Belmont County, Ohio, shall be authorized to take any action on behalf of Belmont County, Ohio, to exclude Belmont County, Ohio, from and/or opt-out of the Negotiation Class certified by the United States District Court in the Northern District of Ohio in *In re National Prescription Opiate Litigation*, MDL 2804.

# IN THE MATTER OF ENTERING INTO A ROADWAY USE MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT WITH OHIO GATHERING COMPANY

Motion made by Mr. Meyer, seconded by Mr. Echemann to enter into a **Roadway Use Maintenance Agreement** with Ohio Gathering Company, effective October 30, 2019, for the use of 1.60 miles of CR-6 (Sharon Road) and 1.10 miles of CR-14 (Farmington Road) for pipeline activity.

Note: County-Wide Bond #K15756408 for \$1 million on file.

#### FOR PIPELINE AND COMPRESSOR PROJECTS AND INFRASTRUCTURE

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into at St. Clairsville, Ohio, by and between THE BELMONT COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, a political subdivision, whose mailing address is 101 W. Main St., Courthouse, St. Clairsville, Ohio 43950 (hereafter "Authority"), and Ohio Gathering <u>Company, L.L.C.</u>, whose mailing address is

43050 Industrial Park Road, Cadiz, Ohio 43907 (Hereafter "Operator"), and shall be as follows:

#### **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, Authority has control of the several county/township roads and bridges within Colerain Township, in Belmont County, Ohio and is required by law to keep such roads in good repair; and

WHEREAS, Operator is the owner of certain right of way and field agreements, and intends to construct, operate and maintain certain facilities [Ohio Gathering Company Pipelines], including pipeline and appurtenant equipment, facilities, impoundments, and pipelines necessary for the operation of the [Ohio Gathering Company Pipelines] (hereafter collectively referred to as "Pipeline Activity") located in <u>Colerain</u> Township, in <u>Belmont</u> County, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, Operator intends to commence use 1.60 miles of CR-6 (Sharon Road) and 1.10 miles of CR-14 (Farmington Road) for the purpose of ingress to and egress from the pipeline facilities [Ohio Gathering Company Pipelines], for traffic necessary for the purpose of constructing the pipeline facilities, (hereinafter referred to collectively as "Pipeline Activity"); and

WHEREAS, Authority and Operator desire to enter into an agreement, providing for the repair and maintenance of said roads and bridges thereon as a result of such Pipeline Activity; and

WHEREAS, if any county or township roads contemplated herein contain any railroad crossings, Section 4 below shall apply; **NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the good faith performance by each party of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Operator agrees to the maintenance and repair of said roads and bridges, to their pre-Pipeline Activity condition or as modified pursuant to Appendix A, thereon for any damages

thereto, as a result of Pipeline Activity related to such sites. **FURTHER**, Operator shall also provide for the strengthening and upgrading of the roads and bridges if mutually agreed to be necessary for the Pipeline Activity, prior to the start of Pipeline Activity. The areas and structures required to be strengthened and/or upgraded shall be determined by an engineer provided by the Operator with the approval of the County Engineer to be provided within thirty (30) days of a written request submitted by the Operator. Operator's engineer shall provide a written report to the County detailing the condition of the roads and appurtenances covered under this Agreement along with any recommendations, if necessary.

**BOTH PARTIES FURTHER AGREE** to the following additional terms and conditions:

- The portion of <u>CR-6</u> (<u>Sharon Road</u>), to be utilized by Operator hereunder, is that exclusive portion beginning at <u>the intersection of</u> <u>CR-14 (Farmington Road)</u> and ending at the intersection of US-250 (Colerain Street). It is understood and agreed that the Operator shall not utilize any of the remainder of <u>CR-6</u> (<u>Sharon Road</u>) for any of its Pipeline Activities hereunder.
- The portion of <u>CR-14 (Farmington Road)</u>, to be utilized by Operator hereunder, is that exclusive portion beginning at <u>the intersection</u> 2. of CR-6 (Sharon Road) and ending at the intersection of US-250 (Colerain Street). It is understood and agreed that the Operator shall not utilize any of the remainder of <u>CR-14 (Farmington Road)</u> for any of its Pipeline Activities hereunder.
- 3. Those portions of said roads and bridges and their appurtenances to be used by Operator hereunder and mutually agreed to require necessary strengthening and/or upgrading by the Operator's Engineer in conjunction with the County Engineer, shall be strengthened and/or upgraded to a condition sufficient and adequate to sustain the anticipated Pipeline Activity by Operator, at Operator's sole expense, and with the advice and approval of the County Engineer as detailed in Appendix A. Thereafter, such roads shall be maintained by Operator for damages caused by Operator's Pipeline Activity, at Operator's sole expense, throughout the term of this Agreement, to a level consistent with the condition of such roads at the commencement of its use by the Operator hereunder or as modified pursuant to Appendix A, as determined by the Operator's engineer and the Belmont County Engineer. The maintenance of aforementioned roads includes the use of a commercially recognized dust palliative to control the airborne dust created and/or contributed to by the Operator or the Operator's contractors and or agents.
- 4. The Operator shall give notice to the railroad at least thirty (30) days prior to any known Pipeline Activity utilizing a railroad crossing so that a joint inspection can determine the condition of the crossing. Additionally, the Operator shall coordinate all work needing to be performed at a railroad crossing with the railroad company at least thirty (30) days prior to starting work on a railroad crossing. If the railroad company fails to respond to the Operator's notice of work needing to be performed at a railroad crossing within thirty (30) days of receipt of such notice, then the railroad waives all rights it has under this agreement with respect to the work specified in the notice. Work performed at a railroad crossing may include a separate agreement at the railroad's discretion. The Authority shall not be liable for any incidents arising out of or related to work performed at any railroad crossing pursuant to this Agreement or any separate Agreement between the Operator and the railroad company, or lack of notification by Operator.
- Either the Operator or the Authority may terminate this Agreement with just cause following at least thirty (30) days written notice to 5. the other of its intent to terminate. As soon as possible after receipt of such notice, the Authority and the Operator shall inspect said roads and bridges and their appurtenances. Following final inspection, the parties shall meet, and all restoration resulting from Operator's Pipeline Activity shall be identified and thereafter completed by the Operator to insure the roads are at least returned to the condition they were in prior to the Operator's use for its Pipeline Activity, at Operator's sole expense. Following completion of all restoration work, this Agreement shall be terminated and of no further force or effect.
- All motor vehicles to be utilized by Operator hereunder, whether owned by Operator or others, shall comply with all legal size, load and weight limits in accordance with State Law, and all non-conforming vehicles shall require the proper local permit.
- Operator shall furnish the Authority with a written Letter of Authority, setting forth all necessary contact information, including a twenty four (24) hour emergency contact number, for the authorized local representative of the Operator, and such information shall be maintained and kept current at all times concerned hereunder.
- If Authority determines that any additional traffic signage is needed, or desired, as a result of this Agreement and in the interests of safety, then Operator shall provide for such signage at Operator's sole expense. In the event that any other safety concerns should arise during the course of this Agreement, Operator and Authority agree that they will mutually discuss such concerns and reach a resolution satisfactory to
- Operator acknowledges that pursuant to Ohio Attorney General Opinion 2012-029 issued on September 19, 2012, the County is required to comply with Revised Code 4115.03-.16 when the total overall project cost to the Operator is fairly estimated to be more than the amount prescribed in Ohio Revised Code Section 4115.03 (B)(4). Operator further acknowledges that at the time any necessary road maintenance or repairs are required, the estimated costs and actual cost of such work to be performed pursuant to this agreement will be solely within the knowledge of Operator since Operator is responsible for paying 100% of said cost. Therefore, Operator hereby agrees that Operator will take all measures to ensure compliance with Ohio's Prevailing Wage Laws.
- Operator shall protect, save, indemnify, and hold the Authority, its officials, agents and employees harmless from any liability, claims, 10. damages, penalties, charges, or costs including reasonable attorney's fees which may arise or be claimed as a result of any violations of any laws or ordinances, or any loss, damage or expense, including injury or death to any person, from any cause or causes from Operator's use of the roads pursuant to this Agreement. "The forgoing indemnity shall not apply to the extent that such claims are attributable to the fault or negligence of the Authority".
- Operator assumes all liability for subcontractors and or agents working on Operator's behalf for this specific agreement. 11.
- 12. This Agreement shall be binding upon Operator and Authority, and their respective successors and assigns.
- In any event that any clause, provision or remedy in this Agreement shall, for any reason, be deemed invalid or unenforceable, the 13. remaining clauses and provisions shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated and shall remain in full force and effect.
- Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Ohio. 14.
- This Agreement shall be in effect on October 30, 2019. 15. Executed in duplicate on the dates set forth below.
