RESOLUTION DECLARING IT NECESSARY TO LEVY A TAX IN EXCESS OF THE TEN MILL LIMITATION

Rev. Code Secs. 5705.19, .191., .192, .21, .26.

The Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio, met in regular session on the 3rd day of August, 2022, at the office of the commissioners with the following members present:

Josh Meyer J. P. Dutton Jerry Echemann

Commissioner Meyer moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

Whereas, the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten mill limitation will be insufficient to provide adequate funding for the necessary requirements of said Belmont County Library District, Belmont County, Ohio; therefore, be it

Resolved, by the Board of Commissioners of Belmont County, Ohio, two-thirds of all members elected thereto concurring, that it is necessary to levy a renewal tax in excess of the ten mill limitation for the benefit of Belmont County Library District, for the purpose of

FUNDING THE BELMONT COUNTY LIBRARY DISTRICT, WHICH INCLUDES MARTINS FERRY CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT; SHADYSIDE LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT; BRIDGEPORT EXEMPTED VILLAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT; UNION LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, That portion within Belmont County; HARRISON HILLS SCHOOL DISTRICT, That portion within Belmont County; BUCKEYE LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, That portion within Belmont County; SWITZERLAND OF OHIO LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, That portion within Belmont County, (EXCLUDING THE BARNESVILLE EMEMPTED VILLAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT, BELLAIRE LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND ST. CLAIRSVILLE-RICHLAND CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT LIBRARIES). FOR CURRENT EXPENSES IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTIONS 5705.03, 5705.23 OF THE REVISED CODE OF OHIO at a rate not to exceed **1 mill** for each one dollar valuation, which amounts to **\$.10** for each one hundred dollars (\$100) of valuation, for a **continuing period of time commencing with tax list year 2023**, for first collection **2024**.

Resolved, that the question of levying additional taxes be submitted to the electors of said Belmont County Library District at the General election to be held at the usual voting places within said Belmont County on the 8th day of November, 2022; and be it further

Resolved, that said levy be placed upon the tax list of the current year after the February settlement next succeeding the election, if a majority of the electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof; and be it further

Resolved, that the Clerk of this Board is hereby directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the Board of Elections of Belmont County, Ohio, forthwith, as provided by law and notify said Board of Elections to cause notice of election on the question of levying a tax to be given as required by law.

Commissioner Dutton seconded the motion and the roll call being called upon its adoption the vote resulted as follows:

Discussion-Mr. Meyer said they had a discussion with the District Library Board since they wanted to go from a five- year renewal to a continuous levy to have a continuous flow of money. There have been cuts from the state. Mr. Dutton said he dislikes continuous levies in general, it has nothing to do with the work of the Library Board and he commended them for the work they do. He said per the Ohio Revised Code the Commissioners have to put the levy on as requested by the Library Board. Mr. Dutton said, "We didn't have much of a choice here in terms of a yes or no voted. Frankly it seems a little bit funny that you have a motion in front of you and you can only vote one way on it. I just fundamentally disagree. It's something I think should be up for review before the taxpayers. A lot of things can change in a short amount of time when it comes to what collections bring in, and that's why I think it's dangerous sometimes to go the continuous route. A lot of things can change in five years, a lot of things can change in 10 years." Mr. Echemann agrees. He said, "Given the opportunity under law, I would have

most certainly have voted no to this, as I don't believe in levies that never end." Mr. Echemann added he doesn't believe in continuous levies because you are not answerable to the public. "Everybody, every person, every organization, should be answerable to the taxpayers, and you won't be if they pass it. I'm up in November, I'm answerable, and that's how it should be," said Mr. Echemann. Library Director Anthony Orsini said the library levy accounts for half of their funding, when it was initially passed it accounted for a third. He said the state funding has been cut over the years so they are more dependent of the levy funds which is needed to maintain services in the community.

OPEN PUBLIC FORUM-Richard Hord, Martins Ferry, asked for an update on jail overcrowding and jail expansion. Mr. Meyer said the numbers are up from where they were during COVID. The current amount of inmates is 148, jail capacity is 144. He said there is some funding from the state, but not a lot for expansion. Expansion cost before COVID was around \$24 million.

Mr. Hord also inquired about the current impact on the oil and gas industry in Belmont County. Mr. Meyer said there is a positive impact. The numbers are up and there is more activity. He noted the sales tax revenue is up for the year. Mr. Dutton said the royalties are put in a separate account, those funds are used for one-time expenditures such as providing local match for the Engineer's projects.
