#### CORONAVIRUS LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUND PAYMENT DUE TO THE

#### REDUCTION IN THE COUNTY'S GENERAL REVENUE AS DUE TO THE COVID-19

### PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY DURING THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT'S PERIOD

#### OF PERFORMANCE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Motion made by Mr. Dutton, seconded by Mr. Echemann to adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Title IX, Subtitle M, Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act, Pub. L. 117-2 [H.R. 1319], signed into law March 11, 2021 ("ARPA"), appropriated Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (the "Fund") payments from the U.S. Treasury Secretary to metropolitan cities, nonentitlement units of local government, and counties; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the ARPA's Fund methodology, Belmont County was allocated approximately \$13,000,000 (the "Fund Payment") to "mitigate the fiscal effects stemming from the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19)"; and,

WHEREAS, in response to this economic crisis, the Department of the Treasury ("**Treasury Department**") is providing such relief to state and local governments to enable them to continue to support the public health response and lay the foundation for a strong and equitable economic recovery; and,

WHEREAS, the ARPA and its supporting guidance issued by the Treasury Department provide that the Fund Payment may only be used by the County to finance costs that (a) respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency or its negative economic impacts; (b) respond to workers performing essential work; (c) provide government services to the extent of reduction in revenue; and (d) make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure (collectively, "Criteria"); and,

WHEREAS, so long as the County duly directs its Fund Payment to finance those costs in compliance with the Criteria, the County may use the Fund Payment to offset the County's various fiscal effects from COVID-19 during the period beginning March 3, 2021, and ending December 31, 2024 (the "Covered Period"); and,

WHEREAS, the Treasury Department has published an Interim Final Rule and a Final Rule with an effective date of April 1, 2022 (collectively, 31 CFR 35.1 *et seq.*), its regularly updated Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds' Frequently Asked Questions, and its Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds: Overview of the Final Rule (collectively, "Guidance"), further explaining the Criteria and the proper use of the Fund Payment during the Covered Period; and,

WHEREAS, this Board intends to take action and deem a portion of the Fund Payment as described herein in a manner consistent with the Final Rule released by the Treasury Department on January 6, 2022, as authorized under said Department's Statement Regarding Compliance with the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds Interim Final Rule and Final Rule.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Belmont, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. Deeming \$10,000,000 of the County's Fund Payment under the "standard allowance" with respect to revenue loss due to COVID-19. That this Board hereby deems that \$10,000,000 of its Fund Payment constitutes the reduction in the County's general revenue due to the public health emergency over the period of performance, all as set forth under the ARPA, the Criteria, and its supporting Guidance, and as specifically authorized under 31 CFR 35.6(d)(1), to wit: "the reduction in the recipient's general revenue due to the public health emergency over the period of performance will be deemed to be ten million dollars".

SECTION 2. As time is of the essence, the duly authorized representatives of the County are directed to take action under this Resolution as soon as possible.

SECTION 3. This Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board and any of its committees concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, all in compliance with Ohio's Sunshine Laws, including Section 121.22 of the Revised Code.

Mr. Dutton said the county received \$13.1 million in ARPA funding and they have not expended any funds yet. A big portion of it will be used towards the new Health Department building. Some water and sewer projects will also be done. The Board of Commissioners are working with Bricker and Eckler law firm on eligible uses. \$10 million can be considered lost revenue and will be put into the General Fund.

# IN THE MATTER OF ENTERING INTO CONTRACT WITH

# AGRI-SLUDGE, INC/SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT

Motion made by Mr. Dutton, seconded by Mr. Echemann to enter into contract, effective January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2027, by and between Agri-Sludge, Inc. and the Belmont County Commissioners, on behalf of the Belmont County Sanitary Sewer District, for services at the Fox Shannon Wastewater Treatment facility at the rate of \$0.0655 per gallon.

*Note: This will be paid from Sewer District Revenues.* 

#### CONTRACT

WITNESSETH, that the contractor and the Owner, for the consideration stated herein, agree as follows:

ARTICLE I, SCOPE OF WORK – The Contractor shall perform, provide and furnish all of the labor, disposal sites, necessary tools, equipment, and all transportation services required to remove and surface land apply cake biosolids from Owners storage tank(s). Both parties agree to the items listed as follows:

- Contractor shall dewater and remove approximately 1,500,000 gallons per year, provide proof of disposal site approval and report to Owner all quantity hauled per site.
- Contractor agrees to install a portable belt filter press on-site and enclose it in a building in one of the drying beds to dewater biosolids on a regular basis, approximately every two to three weeks.
- Contractor agrees to work within the guidelines of Owners sludge management plan and comply with any Ohio and Federal laws governing the disposal of the material, including providing monthly data for Annual Sludge Reports.
- The work shall be performed within an acceptable time frame suitable to Owner, weather permitting.
- 5. Owner will provide a minimum of 1,000,000 gallons per year of product to dewater, or be charged for said remainder at the end of each calendar year.
- Owner agrees to provide all testing necessary for the biosolids prior to removal and filling out and signing the Notice and Necessary Information form.
- Owner agrees to load cake from drying beds and/or storage bins onto Contractors dump trucks for removal and disposal at EPA approved sites.
- 8. Owner provides reasonable access to Contractor for completing the work.
- Owner will provide water and power to perform said dewatering services.

<u>ARTICLE II, THE CONTRACT PRICE</u> - The Owner shall pay to the Contractor for the performance of this Contract, subject to any additions or deductions provided herein, in current funds, the Contract price computed as follows:

1) Agri-Sludge, Inc. would charge <u>\$0.0655</u> per gallon for a dewatering option, and provide, install, operate and maintain one used 0.74-meter or larger portable belt filter press that would be placed into an enclosed drying bed area. This option will include supplying the building, equipment, labor, transportation, disposal, and polymer for this option.

ARTICLE III, TERM OF CONTRACTURAL SERVICES - The duration of this Contract shall be from January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2027. This Contract may be renewed upon mutual agreement by both parties.

ARTICLE IV, PAYMENT — Owner agrees to pay Contractor upon completion of work each month. Payment will be due 30 days from invoicing or as soon thereafter as said funds are made available by the Director of Finance of the Owner.

ARTICLE V, INSURANCE AND WORKERS' COMPENSATION - Contractor will provide a Certificate of Commercial General Liability insurance in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000, a Certificate of Transportation Pollution Liability insurance in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 and a Workers' Compensation Certificate at the signing of the Contract.

Discussion on motions-Frank Papini, St. Clairsville, asked why the \$10 million ARPA funds are being put in the General Fund. Mr. Dutton said they will be using the funds for projects under the guidelines and the funds will be expended carefully. Mr. Echemann noted a portion of the ARPA funds were invested and are earning \$5,000 in interest monthly, there are no restrictions on how those funds are spent.

**OPEN PUBLIC FORUM-**Tim Lara, Kirkwood Township Trustee, asked about the water study in the Hendrysburg area. Mr. Dutton said a firm is working on it and the cost is being split with Guernsey County. He said it will all come down to the cost of the project if it is feasible.

Ron Graham, York Township Trustee, asked for an update on the slip on a township road. He said he did talk to the Commissioners on Monday and they mentioned a study is being done. Mr. Dutton said a geotechnical study is being done. He suggested the township apply for OPWC Emergency funding. Mr. Graham said an application was submitted. They are also pursuing funding through EPA of Ohio, but would have to partner with another township because the costs need to be \$300,000. He's estimating the slip will be \$152,000 to repair. Match money would be needed either way and asked if the county would be willing to pay the match. Mr. Dutton said that will be discussed if the funds are received.

Frank Shaffer, Pultney Township Trustee, commented on the euthanizing of dogs at the shelter. He said his daughter had worked there and they don't take it lightly. Mr. Dutton said the Belmont County Animal Shelter is considered a no kill shelter. 90% of dogs are placed. Some dogs have been there 3 to 4 years. The shelter staff is doing everything they can to get the dogs adopted. Mr. Meyer said the dog warden is very compassionate. She looks at other rescues in the country and is expanding looking into Canada. Mr. Echemann said under the law if percentage of euthanizations are low it is still considered a no kill shelter.
