## Standard Form of Agreement between Owner and Engineer for Professional Tank Evaluation Services

## WITNESSETH:

That for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises between the parties hereto, it is hereby agreed:

#### **SECTION 1 - SERVICES OF ENGINEER**

- 1.1. The ENGINEER agrees to provide professional tank evaluation services in accordance with the ENGINEER's proposa to the OWNER dated April 17, 2023.
- 1.2. If ENGINEER is requested to perform professional services in addition to those services outlined in the ENGINEERS proposal to the OWNER dated April 17, 2023, a new agreement will be required. This agreement is only for the scope of services stated above in paragraphs 1.1.

## **SECTION 2 - OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES**

OWNER shall do the following in a timely manner so not to delay the services of ENGINEER.

- 2.1. Designate in writing a person to act as OWNER's representative with respect to the services to be rendered under this Agreement. Such person shall have complete authority to transmit instructions, receive information, interpret, and define OWNER's policies and decisions with respect to ENGINEER's services for the Project.
- 2.2. Provide all criteria and full information as to ENGINEER's services hereunder as to OWNER's requirements for the Project, including design objectives and constraints, space, capacity and performance requirements, flexibility and expandability, and any budgetary limitations; and furnish copies of all design and construction standards which OWNER currently has, if any.
- 2.3. Arrange for access to and make all provisions for ENGINEER to enter upon public and private property as required for ENGINEER to perform services under this Agreement.
- 2.4. Give prompt written notice to ENGINEER whenever OWNER observes or otherwise becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or timing of ENGINEER's services, or any defect or nonconformance in the work of any Contractor affecting the Project.
- 2.5. Perform the duties required under the Terms section (if any) of the Proposal.
- 2.6. The information and services to be provided by OWNER under this Section will be without cost to ENGINEER.

## **SECTION 3 - PAYMENTS TO ENGINEER**

OWNER shall pay ENGINEER for Services rendered in the amounts outlined in the Proposal to the OWNER dated April 17, 2023. OWNER shall issue payment to ENGINEER within 30 calendar days of receipt of properly submitted invoice.

## **SECTION 4 - TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

- 4.1. Professional Responsibility ENGINEER represents that the services shall be performed, within the limits presented by OWNER, in a manner consistent with the level of care and skill ordinarily exercised by other professional consultants under similar circumstances at the time the services are performed. No other representations to OWNER, expressed or implied and no warranty or guarantee is included in this Agreement, or in any report, opinion, document, or otherwise.
- 4.2. **Termination** The obligation to perform under the terms of this Agreement may be terminated by ENGINEER upon thirty (30) days' written notice to OWNER in the event of substantial failure of OWNER to perform in accordance with the terms hereof. This Agreement may be terminated by OWNER with or without cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to ENGINEER. OWNER shall compensate ENGINEER for all work performed up to and including the termination date.

- 4.3. Re-Use of Documents All documents furnished by the ENGINEER pursuant to this Agreement are instruments of services in respect to the Project and the ENGINEER shall retain Ownership of said documents whether or not the Project is completed. The OWNER may make and retain any additional copies for information and reference in connection with the use of the Project by OWNER and others for the Project; however, such documents are not intended or represented to be suitable for re-use by OWNER or others on extensions of the Project or on any other project. Any re-use without the express written consent of the ENGINEER will be at re-user's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to the ENGINEER. The granting of such consent will entitle the ENGINEER to further compensation at rates to be agreed upon by OWNER and the ENGINEER.
- 4.4. Insurance ENGINEER shall procure and maintain workers' compensation, automobile, general liability, and professional liability insurance. Upon receipt of this executed Agreement, ENGINEER shall provide OWNER with certificates of insurance for OWNER's review and use.
- 4.5. Indemnification The ENGINEER agrees to indemnify OWNER, their officers employees, and agents against, and will hold and save them harmless from claims, damages, losses or omissions due to the negligence of the ENGINEER in the performance of this Agreement, but only for that portion of such negligence of the ENGINEER compared to the total negligence of all persons, firms, or corporations which results in said damages to OWNER. The ENGINEER shall not be liable for any consequential damages. The fees listed in the Proposal to OWNER dated April 17, 2023, are based upon the total liability to the ENGINEER not exceeding \$50,000 or the contract amount, whichever is greater.

This will be paid for by the Auditor's office.*MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE BELMONT COUNTY AUDITOR AND THE BELMONT SOIL AND WATER

CONSERVATION DISTRICT

This memorandum of understanding is entered into on this <u>26th</u> day of April, 2023, by and between the Belmont County Auditor, whose principal place of business is 101 West Main Street, St. Clairsville, OH 43950, (hereinafter called the Auditor), the Belmont Soil and Water Conservation District, a soil and water conservation district organized and existing under the laws of the State of Ohio, whose principal place of business is 130 West Main Street, St. Clairsville, OH 43950, (hereinafter called the "District".)

#### WITNESSETH

Whereas, the Auditor is responsible for the implementation and enforcement of CAUV, and

Whereas, landowners are responsible for complying with CAUV rules through agriculture and silviculture, and

Whereas, the Auditor is responsible for performing compliance checks for the CAUV program, and

Whereas, the District has the required technical knowledge and capability to perform such reviews and visits and

Whereas, the District is responsible for the conservation and management of natural resources,

and

Whereas, recognizing this mutual concern and responsibility, the Auditor and the District set forth their responsibilities in a Memorandum of Understanding.

It is therefore agreed:

- 1. Within the limitations of its authorities and resources, the Auditor shall:
  - a. Cooperate with the District in the development and implementation of a program that will both assist and educate landowners in the aspects of the CAUV programs.
  - b. Provide the amount of Twenty-Five Thousand dollars (\$25,000) for one year of service provided by the Belmont SWCD (District) staff for the CAUV program.
  - c. Payment will be made at the start of every year of service agreed upon by the Auditor and District.
- 2. Within the limitations of its authorities and resources, the District shall:
  - a. Work with the Auditor by evaluating properties currently enrolled in the CAUV program and reporting these findings in writing to the Auditor as completed.
  - b. Work with landowners by helping them stay in compliance with CAUV specifications by providing conservation practice assistance.
  - c. Work with woodlot owners by helping them to stay in compliance with CAUV specifications by providing contact information of consulting foresters that write Forest Management Plans.
- 3. It is mutually agreed:
  - a. This is a contract that is in effect from April 2023 through April 2024, but will be terminated at any time by either party giving a 90-day notice in writing to the other party.
  - b. That this Contract may only be amended by a written amendment, signed by both parties.
  - c. This Contract shall be interpreted according to the laws of the State of Ohio.
  - d. That the Auditor is responsible for all "initial applications", all Complaints filed with the Board of Revision, and for getting the list of "Renewals" that need to be reviewed by the District.
  - e. The District is responsible for "Renewals" to be reviewed per the list provided by the Auditor.
  - f. It is understood between both parties that the District will check half of the county's renewals in one contracted year.
  - g. That if any term, provision, covenant, or condition of this memorandum is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions shall remain in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected, impaired, and invalidated.

Mr. Dutton said a lot of work has been done in the water and sewer area over the past five to six years. The county's sewer plant was upgraded through USDA funding in a major package that was secured a few years ago. He said this is additional work that they want to do to the sewer system over the next year or two.

**Shelter Volunteer Program-**Mr. Dutton said there has been no update on the discussion from last week. Dog Warden Lisa Duvall was out of the office last week on a prescheduled leave. Mr. Dutton said there is a meeting scheduled with her to discuss potential changes to the program and we hope to have an update by next week. He said, "We felt the conversation requires all three commissioners, while we work every day, we do not meet as a group every day. We meet only on scheduled times as an entire board so that does limit the times we can have conversations as a group."

RFQ Animal Shelter-Mr. Dutton said the motion was made last week to advertise for RFQ's for a new Animal Shelter facility. We have been evaluating if the current facility could be expanded, retrofitted or improved. Mr. Dutton said in their opinion at this point they don't feel there is a good option with the facility moving forward. The best thing, long term, would be to evaluate a new facility. The idea with the RFQ is to bring an expert on to look at it and put together a conceptional design and estimated cost before a determination can be made. Mr. Dutton said Candace Fleagane has been a very big advocate for a new facility for a very long time and has approached the board on several occasions about the facility. He said the board has never disagreed with her, but they have been dealing with tremendous backlog when it comes to facilities. Mr. Dutton said, "We are making a lot of good progress on facilities. Sometimes it is unfortunate to have to deal with facilities because it takes a lot of time and attention. At the end of the day, you can't have buildings that are just deteriorating to the point that we have let some of buildings deteriorate to." Ms. Fleagane said she is in charge of Belmont County Cat Stray Shun. She is at the Belmont County Animal Shelter 3 to 5 hours every day. Ms. Fleagane said she is so happy this announcement has been made and will do everything in her power to help raise money for the facility and she is hoping others will do the same.

**Deputy Tim Scott-**Mr. Dutton acknowledged Deputy Scott on his retirement after 25 years with the Belmont County Sheriff's office. He said Deputy Scott made sure the security at the Courthouse is as it should be. Mr. Dutton said there is no bigger advocate in the county better to look at deficiencies at certain points with the security and make sure they were addressed and acknowledged. Mr. Dutton said they very much appreciate everything he has done making sure the employees and general public are safe.

**OPEN PUBLIC FORUM-**Richard Hord, Martins Ferry, asked for comments on the status of the injection well located at the intersection of Route 40 and State Route 331. Mr. Dutton said they were opposed to the location of the Omni project since its inception. They did work with the Belmont County Port Authority at the time to try to reach out to the project lead and express concerns and provide guidance to look at other locations. All of those opinions were voiced to the leaders at the state level because the county had no standing in terms of making a determination on the location. Omni had to go through the proper permitting with the Ohio Department of Transportation and Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) and others. Mr. Dutton said they met with Governor DeWine at one point on the project. He said the project has not proceeded as planned. The board checks with ODNR regularly on the status of the project, the status has not changed for quite some time. Mr. Dutton said they made a push with the State of Ohio and their legislatures and was able to get state law changed for future sites. That project would not meet standards today. He noted they very much support the oil and gas industry in Belmont County.
