Background and Purpose

The purpose of this Thoroughfare Plan is to serve as the Plan for Major Streets and Highways per Ohio Revised Code Section 711.10 and to establish a roadway network in Belmont County. The Plan classifies all roadways in the unincorporated area of Belmont county in accordance with the guidelines of the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT). The roadways are depicted on the map attached hereto and incorporated herein as part of this Thoroughfare Plan. Historically, the widths of the rights of way associated with the roads in the network vary, and some are unknown. Information regarding the width of any roadway right of way is available at https://www.belcogis.com/historical.htm.

The Thoroughfare Plan for Belmont County, Ohio consists of the following roadway classifications:

Interstate (ODOT Class 01):

Roadways in this functional classification category are officially designated as Interstates by the U.S. Secretary of Transportation, and all routes that comprise the Dwight D. Eisenhower National System of Interstate and Defense Highways belong to the Interstate functional classification category. These are constructed to accommodate long distance travel. The right of way widths are determined by the federal government and ODOT.

Other Freeways and Expressways (ODOT Class 02):

Roads in this classification have directional travel lanes, are usually separated by some type of physical barrier, and access and egress points are limited to on/off ramp locations or a very limited number of at-grade intersections. These roadways are designed and constructed to maximize mobility and do not directly serve abutting land uses. The recommended right of way width for future roadways in this classification is 100 feet.

Principal Arterial (ODOT Class 03):

Principal Arterials provide a high degree of mobility through the unincorporated areas of the county and allow for movements along continuous routes with shorter travel times. These roadways serve major activity centers and allow for higher travel speeds. The recommended right of way width for future roadways in this classification is 100 feet.

Minor Arterial (ODOT Class 04):

Minor Arterials provide service for trips of moderate length and connect to the Principal Arterials. Minor Arterials generally provide for one travel lane in each direction, relatively high traffic speeds, and provide for intra-county, rather than statewide travel. The recommended right of way width for future roadways in this classification is 100 feet.

Major and Minor Collectors (ODOT Class 05 & 06):

Collectors gather and channel traffic from Local Roads to the arterial network. Major Collectors (ODOT Class 05) provide service to the county seat and to larger towns not directly served by arterials. Major Collectors serve intra-county travel corridors. Minor Collectors (ODOT Class 06) collect traffic from local roads and provide service to smaller communities not served by a higher classification of roadway. The recommended right of way width for future roadways classified as Major Collectors is 80 feet. The recommended right of way width for future roadways classified as Minor Collectors is 60 feet.

Local Roads (ODOT Class 07):

Local Roads account for the largest percentage of all roadways in terms of mileage. They are intended for travel over a short distance, and allow for access to adjacent land. Local Roads are all roads not characterized as Interstate, Expressway, Arterials or Collectors. The recommended right of way width for future roadways classified as Local Roads is 60 feet.
