WHEREAS, while BCHD will continue to rent the space for the WIC offices, BCHD has requested that BOC pay utilities necessary
for the operation of the WIC offices; and

WHEREAS, BOC has agreed to pay such utilities.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties set forth their mutual understanding with respect to payment for the utilities:

- (1) BCHD will pay those bills it receives for electric, water, and sewer services provided to the WIC offices located at 3326 Belmont Street, Bellaire, Ohio 43906.
- (2) BCHD will then submit those bills to the BOC for reimbursement. Upon submission of those bills to the BOC, BOC shall reimburse BCHD the full amount for utilities provided to the WIC offices at that location on a monthly basis.
- (3) The parties agree that the foregoing arrangement will continue only so long as the WIC offices continue to be housed in their current location, unless earlier terminated by either party on thirty days' written notice. Executed this 10th day of January 2024.
