RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it has been reported that the General Assembly and the Administration of Governor Bob Taft is considering cuts to the current FY 2002/2003 State Budget as a result of the third ruling in the DeRolph school funding court case and because state revenue projections have been revised downward by one billion dollars; and

WHEREAS, counties are dependent on the state budget for the provision of many necessary services to the residents of their counties; and

WHEREAS, this Board understands that one of the options under consideration is the elimination or reduction of Ohio's Local Government Funds which are a major source of revenue to the county and other local units of government in the county; and

WHEREAS, also under consideration are line item cuts in the state budget that will significantly affect the ability of counties to provide services and administer mandated state programs in such areas as human services, children's services, child support enforcement, juvenile justice, adult corrections, legal services for indigent defendants, and other areas; and

WHEREAS, various methods to enhance state revenues are under consideration including the utilization of Ohio's "rainy day fund", the elimination of certain current state tax exemptions, and selected tax increases.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BELMONT COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

- This Board opposes any additional reductions to Ohio's Local Government Funds, a primary source of revenue to the county and many other local governments in this county. Any discussions about the elimination of such funding for local governments is irresponsible and will result in the reduction of vital county services or the increase of local taxes, or both.
- This Board opposes a general across the board line item cut to the state budget. Such across the board cuts to each line item will have a negative impact on various subsidy accounts that are distributed to counties and will have significant negative consequences to programs, adult corrections programs, TANF, child welfare services, child care programs, child support enforcement, and others. Such cuts will have the net result of reduced services or local tax increases, or both.
- This Board urges the Taft Administration and the Ohio General Assembly to prudently tap Ohio's rainy day fund, enhance revenues, and/or increase taxes to solve the state budget problem without transferring the burden to local units of government. This Board, in particular, supports the elimination of certain current exemptions from the state sales and use tax to assist in permanently making up the long term revenue shortfall being experienced by the state. The elimination of certain sales tax exemptions will also have the effect of enhancing county revenue from the permissive sales and use tax, as county receipts from this source of county revenue are also on the decline.

- This Board also urges the General Assembly and the Taft Administration to take great care in the enactment of new legislation that will mandate new costs on county government.
- This Board also urges the General Assembly and the Taft Administration to enact various legislative proposals that will give counties additional options to raise revenue locally and to allow counties additional flexibility to make programs more efficient and cost effective as has been proposed by the County Commissioners Association of Ohio.

Commissioner Olexo stated the Ohio State Budget was short about six hundred million dollars in sales tax revenue and there are more cuts coming. He stated, "There is a lot of speculation on where the next cuts may be, the local government funds have already been frozen and may be cut more. Commissioner continued stating, "Local Government Funds have always been an important part of what we can do to support our townships and villages, that is why we want to do anything we can to stop this. We have a press release stating the particulars as to where cuts come from."

BELMONT COUNTY COMMISSIONERS EXPRESS CONCERNS OVER POSSIBLE STATE BUDGET REDUCTIONS

When the Belmont County Commissioners met on October 10, 2001, the status of Ohio's two-year state budget was on the minds of the Commissioners and was a primary topic of discussion.

The state has two big problems that must be fixed. Even though the state budget attempted to address the school funding crisis, the Ohio Supreme Court has said that the "fix" is not acceptable. While the State has asked the Supreme Court to reconsider its ruling, most observers believe that the state may have to come up with as much as an additional \$1.2 Billion per year to satisfy the Court. On top of this problem, the Governor's top financial advisors believe that the current two-year state budget is out of balance by \$1 Billion, or \$500 Million each year. The bottom line could be a problem of \$1.7 Billion each year.

The Governor and legislative leaders have been meeting to look for ways to fill the gap in the state budget. Amid a flurry of rumors coming out of Columbus, Commissioners are alarmed that many of the cuts may be simply transferred onto the back of counties and other local governments.

One idea echoing in the halls of the Statehouse is that the state may eliminate or cut Ohio's local government funds. These funds are distributed to counties, townships, municipalities, park districts and libraries. In most counties, local government funding is the third or fourth single largest source of money that makes up the county budget. Under the current state budget, these funds were already frozen, and at that time the estimated statewide loss to local governments was estimated at almost \$200 Million.

According to Commissioners' President Ryan E. "Rick" Olexo, the elimination or additional cuts could be disastrous to county finances. "Given that the local government funds are such a significant portion of our budget, we would either have to reduce programs or look at other ways to fund these programs. It seems unfair that the state is even considering balancing its budget on the backs of counties and other political subdivisions."

IN THE MATTER OF PRESS RELEASE

RE: CONCERNS OVER POSSIBLE STATE BUDGET REDUCTIONS (CONT'D)

Also of concern to Commissioners is possible line item cuts in the state budget. Since counties are so dependent on the state budget, across the board cuts could impact the administration of welfare and other human service programs, child support enforcement, juvenile justice programs, and adult corrections initiatives. According to Commissioner Olexo, most of these programs are mandated by the state and a reduction in state funding will result in even more fiscal mandates on the county. "The County's budget was already affected by cuts in the original state budget - I am not sure how much more we can take", said Commissioner Olexo.

The solution? Commissioners believe that the prudent utilization of the state's "rainy day fund" and revenue enhancements are the best options. According to Commissioner Olexo, "While there may be some disagreement over how hard it is raining, now is the time for the state to tap the rainy day fund. The problem is that the rainy day fund is one time money and with the DeRalph III school funding decision and the economic slowdown, it looks like there is a long-term problem that can only be solved by generating more revenue. We certainly urge our state leaders to step up to the plate and solve the problem without just shoving the problem onto the backs of counties and other local units of government."

During their session, the commissioners also adopted a resolution expressing their concerns and directed the commissioners' clerk to send a copy to Governor Taft, leaders of the General Assembly and local legislators. Commissioners also plan to contact Senator James Carnes and Representative Charles Wilson to make their concerns known and to represent the County's position with regards to this situation.

The rates are established for each area to meet the obligations of that portion of the District and it must treat all commercial users equally. Your second request is as follows: "Allow Belmont Hills to collect fees or easements across our property to the residents of Mills Road and the Almar Subdivision and connect them to our sanitary sewer system."
