OPEN PUBLIC FORUM - Mike Bianconi said he wanted to bring Mr. Thomas up to speed as to what some of his concerns are. It is the end of the year and he would like reports on 1) how much we have spent on attorney fees for Senior Services for the year and Job and Family Services, and how much was spent on consultants for both. 2) He also would like to know how much was spent on what he calls the Mall Road attorney in 2013. 3) He has been asking for months and months for a report similar to the one of August 29, 2012, from the management team at Job and Family Services. He wants a report on what they inherited and what they have done until the transfer on Nov. 1, 2013. Example: How many meals, transports, etc. He would like the management team to come in and give a presentation. He is requesting this information after the first of the year.

Richard Hord asked how the attorney services of Mark Lucas of Clemans-Nelson, who provided assistance regarding the transition of Senior Services as well as the search for a new DJFS director, were secured. Mrs. Favede advised the board has a contract with them at a negotiated rate to utilize their services. The services of Mark Lucas are at times utilized separately under his own private firm.

Mr. Hord noted the Open House to be held tomorrow for the former Sheriff's residence. He asked what the overall costs were for the renovations. Mrs. Favede stated it was the amount of the grant plus \$150,000 from Belmont Co. Tourism, which was the matching grant; \$70,000 to the Dept. of Development for the design fees for the architect firm and maybe some in-kind work on behalf of our Maintenance Department. The Ohio Dept. of Federal Enhancement Transportation Byways grant was between \$650,000 - \$700,000. Mrs. Favede noted according to the documents prior to when she came into office, the Phase I, which was the Sheriff's residence, was actually budgeted at \$1.2 million. Mr. Hord asked if there were any plans for renovation of the remainder of the building, the jail portion. Mrs. Favede said that in 2011 after she submitted the Phase II application, that particular fund was discontinued at the federal level. She said at this point there is no venue for additional funds/grants for that building.

Mr. Hord asked if there have been any changes regarding the delivery of services for seniors under the new configuration of Belmont Senior Services. Mrs. Favede said the number of individuals served continues to grow. They are struggling to put out the meals that they are required to put out in that kitchen. They are topping out at what they can actually handle. It is a very small facility. They are adding some routes. The TRIPS program will be added today.

DISCUSSION HELD RE: DOG SHELTER – Mr. Coffland stated after last week with the dog shelter issues and all the complaints and the complaints that continue to come in via calls and emails, the board is looking into the problem. The board asks that the media put that out and to give us time. We are hearing from people on both sides and the board needs time to look into this matter to come up with a solution. Mrs. Favede advised the Clerk is working on setting up an executive session today with our legal counsel, the Prosecutor's Office, in order to address that issue. Mr. Thomas followed up saying that we are being inundated with dozens of emails from people all over the country regarding the animal shelter. With that said, we all value comment from everybody regardless of whether it is pro or con on an issue. However, it is going to take some time to have the issues that were raised last week to be addressed. We also have the BCARL board that we contract with to also investigate some of these issues and be able to respond back to us. There is not going to be any immediate decisions with regard to the animal shelter because there is a lot of due diligence that needs to take place before a decision can be made. Mr. Thomas has just been put in this situation and plans on being extra cautious on looking at both sides. He said it is important for the public to know that we will respond to everyone accordingly, and we want to make sure that we and their board investigate. We simply own the facility and provide the facility by statute. The contractual arrangement with BCARL is what needs to be addressed. Mr. Thomas has received 6-8 positive phone calls and/or emails about the animal shelter. He said regardless of all the allegations there is still a lot of good being done every day at the animal shelter. Mrs. Favede noted this has gone beyond the country and she has received an email from Germany. Mr. Thomas said the presentation made last week was enough, but he does not mean to discourage people from contacting the board. The board has stated they will look into matters and that is what they will do.

Meg Bizzarri asked if suggestions couldn't be given for some minor quick fixes. She said one being with the weather the way it is right now to lay down some straw. She said every picture you see the dogs are standing in mud. She said around the holidays a lot of the county shelters cut their adoption fees so people can afford to adopt. She said she has heard Belmont County's adoption fees are way beyond what people are willing to pay. Mr. Thomas said those are valid comments. He does not disagree. Speaking personally he stated, "Here's what I don't want to get into, is micro-managing any department or agency in this county. And that's across the board; it's not just BCARL. While your comments are well taken and I hear them, and I have no problem passing that on, my goal is that we get first the issues and allegations that are made, good, bad or indifferent, resolved. The second thing, and that's where the legal counsel comes in, is to discuss the contractual issues that the board now has with BCARL and whether or not in the future any of these need changed.
