DISCUSSION HELD RE: 2012 ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS – Mr. Coffland said he would like to note the appropriation amount is almost the same as last year. He said the past month has been spent working with some, not all departments, on this budget. Most departments were informed that their budgets would be the same as last year. Discussions were held with the Auditor and Fiscal Manager. Mrs. Favede stated that it is important to note that sales tax is up, but it has certainly not returned to the level of what it was in the county's heyday by any means. Some of that growth has been leveled out by the loss of local government funds. In addition to that, we have lost money in interest since the rates are down. She concluded that we go into this year no better than last year, but at the same time, no worse. She expects 2012 to be a good financial year. Mr. Probst also said that this is very close to last year's certification that will be appropriated to the different department heads and offices. He said he believes there were five departments requesting an increase in their appropriations this year. He said "By no means are we out of the woods. We still have to be cautious and proceed as we have in the past in 2011." Mr. Probst stated the

following: We are trying to keep all offices operating as efficiently as we can. What is given to the different departments is going to be comparable to that in 2011. Mr. Probst advised he would like to caution all departments that are asking for increases in their appropriations that it is not going to happen this year. We are expecting a 9% to 12 % increase in healthcare premiums. There are good things happening. A variety of companies are looking to locate in Belmont County. The Board has been working with the Port Authority and Community Improvement Corp., for well over a year on some of these projects. The oil and gas industry that is here is definitely going to be a help, but we won't see very much of an increase, if any, this year from that. We are laying the groundwork to be able to benefit from this in the future. We will continue to work with our departments as the year goes forward and help them in any way we can.

Mr. Coffland remarked that this past year the board negotiated and signed contracts with all our unions for a three year term. He also noted, "we were able to compensate our employees with a very small raise this past year. Hopefully things will get better. It was the first raise that a lot of employees had since 2007."

OPEN PUBLIC FORUM

Mr. Ed Jagucki asked the board if the rules and regulations for drilling in and around villages and communities were the same as coal mines are required to meet. Mr. Coffland said he did not think so. Port Authority Director Larry Merry answered that the thing that is similar with coal mines and the oil and gas is permitting is done through Ohio Dept. of Natural Resources (ODNR). The permitting is a state issue. There are setbacks as far as how close the drilling can be to residences and the work activity, but that is regulated by ODNR. Mr. Merry advised that currently you cannot drill a well through an area that has an underground mine. Mr. Probst added that with the coal mining industry there was so much money per ton taken out that went back to a reclamation fund and toward loss of water tables. The coal company was responsible for making sure waterlines were put back in if there was a loss of water due to mining. Mr. Probst agreed that if fracking would cause contamination of water there should absolutely be something in place to fix the problem. Mr. Merry stated they come in and test all water resources before they drill, within some cases up to two miles away from the well. Within a mile, all the drilling companies go around and take samples of the wells and drinking resources before they start to drill.

Mayor Robert Thomas of Brookside attended again today and stated he has to let ODOT know within the next three months whether they are to go forward with their project that will extend towards Blaine. He said he would hate to see Brookside not be able to come up with their 20% that is requested. He asked the board if there was any way they could help them out in the future. He said he has been Mayor for 21 years and has never asked anything from the Commissioners. He said he thinks it's time that Brookside got some of the tax money that the other part of the county gets. He said his council's only move is to go ahead with the project and hope that somewhere along the line they can get money. He has been searching for grants. He also said the bad thing about it they can't put any other federal monies this. The match is 20% of \$395,000.00 or \$72,000.00 that is needed.

Mrs. Favede asked the Mayor if he had a copy of the application that was submitted that secured the Transportation Enhancement Grant to begin with. He replied, "No." She said if we can review the project itself something may signify a certain way we can go. She needs to review the grant documents to see what resources there may be. Mr. Coffland said he would recommend they go ahead and apply. Mr. Probst thought they may be able to look into Revolving Loan Fund monies. He also said there may be some in-kind services they could provide as part of the match, which would reduce the figure. The project needs reviewed before any recommendations can be made.

Pultney Township Trustee Frank Shaffer informed the board the in the last year he has been utilizing some of the services at Connections. He said he believes they are doing a great job and it needs to be used more. He advised there is a little jeopardy with the computer classes. They are trying to eliminate with Belmont Tech. He said it would be great if the board could help save that. Also he took a workshop that on how to apply for Marcellus Shale jobs. He said he was told there are 7 to 8 computers of which only 3 work. There are not enough working computers to help and asked if the board could look into that.

Richard Hord asked the board what their top priorities are for 2012. Mr. Coffland said, as always continued job growth and expanding our retail, manufacturing and industrial base. Unemployment is down, the housing market is up and the union halls are working. Mr. Coffland concluded that Belmont County is are moving in the right direction.

Mr. Hord asked if the board would continue holding town hall meetings this year. Mr. Coffland said in 2010 they held one in almost all villages and cities and in 2011 they went to all 16 townships. Mrs. Favede stated that Commissioner Probst is President this year and he will be given the opportunity to decide what he would like to do.
