**OPEN PUBLIC FORUM** –Commissioner Favede noted that Commissioner Probst is on vacation this week.

Richard Hord asked what the current salary was for the position of the Director of the Dept. of Job and Family Services and would it be reduced now that the Senior Program is no longer going to be a part of the agency. Mrs. Favede asked if he was talking about Dwayne Pielech or the new person. Mr. Hord clarified he was asking about the new person to be hired. Mrs. Favede said the new person would not make the same as Mr. Pielech whose salary is based upon 16 years of service. Mrs. Favede replied, "It depends on the candidate. We have a range." Mr. Hord also inquired if the position has a residency requirement. Mr. Coffland stated there wasn't the last time. Mr. Hord asked if there had been plans made to keep Mr. Pielech on as a consultant to help train the new person. Mrs. Favede replied, "We do not." Mr. Hord asked if it has been determined where the Senior Services administrative offices would be. Mrs. Favede stated, "When Senior Services was a separate agency, it was always at Oakview. We've not taken over any of that space that was utilized by them before." She added she assumes that at

some time in the future we will be making arrangements to move forward with constructing a new facility and that all Senior Services would operate under that roof. Mr. Hord then asked if it had been assured at this point that there will be no interruption in services of the seniors as a result of the new configuration. Mrs. Favede replied, "Regardless of any activities within the organization, there is always a commitment to no interruption of services. That is our main function to provide those services."

Frank Papini said he read about the budget the Governor signed and asked if it has any trickle-down effect as far as Belmont County is concerned. He does not see where we are benefiting too much from the budget or the proposed cuts. Mrs. Favede said one of the most devastating trickle-down effects is the change in the taxing. She said we are already struggling in Belmont County to get school levies passed. The changes are going to make the ability to pass a school levy or any new levy more difficult than ever. The Martins Ferry Library is trying to form a District Library and pass a levy. This will make the ability to put on a levy for that district incredibly difficult. Mr. Papini asked if there was anything positive. Mrs. Favede said, "My answer to that is, 'no'." She explained the severance tax as proposed did not make it into the budget, so that is positive. The majority of the impacted counties over the past 2 weeks had taken similar action to what we had taken which said we did not support it as it was proposed with the counties not receiving any direct benefits. The same language was passed by Monroe, Noble, Harrison, Carroll and Guernsey Counties opposing the severance tax.

Mrs. Favede read a portion of a letter penned by State Rep. Jack Cera regarding the elimination of the 12½% rollback for new levies. He wrote: 'As we all know, districts in our area have struggled to pass operating levies and I am concerned about how the public will react to proposed levies for school safety when we are eliminating educational programs. In addition, we all just learned of the tax proposals that will be coming out of the budget conference committee. One of the proposals eliminates the 12½% property tax rollback for new levies. This will mean that property owners will be required to pay more if a new levy passes. This will make it even more difficult for both schools and the county to pass new levies. It is unclear at this time how it will affect renewals.'

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Belmont, Ohio, met in regular session at <u>10:00 a.m.</u> on July 3, 2013, at the commissioners meeting room, located at the Courthouse, St. Clairsville, Ohio, with the following members present:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Belmont County Board of Commissioners anticipates levying a tax in excess of the ten mill limitation as described herein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5705.03 of the Ohio Revised Code as amended by Am. Sub. S.B. No 201 enacted by the 122<sup>nd</sup> General Assembly, this Board of Commissioners is required to certify to the County Auditor a resolution requesting the County Auditor to certify certain matters in connection with such a tax levy;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners:

**SECTION 1.** That pursuant to the provisions of Section 5705.19(Y) of the Ohio Revised Code, it is necessary that a renewal tax be levied in excess of the ten mill limitation for the benefit of Belmont County for the purpose of

A renewal tax for the benefit of Belmont County, Ohio to supplement the General Fund for the purpose of providing senior services including but not limited to, transportation, nutrition and in-home services to elderly residents who are frail and or handicapped, at a rate not exceeding one and one half mills (1.5) mills for each one dollar (\$1.00) of valuation, which amounts to fifteen cents (\$.15) for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of valuation, for a period of five (5) years, commencing with tax list year 2013 (Ohio Revised Code Section 5705.05)

**SECTION 2**. That the question of the passage of said tax levy shall be submitted to the electors of Belmont County at an election to be held on the <u>fifth</u> day of <u>November, 2013</u>. If approved by the electors, said tax levy shall first be placed upon the <u>2013</u> tax list and duplicate, for first collection in calendar year <u>2014</u>.

**SECTION 3.** That pursuant to Section 5705.03(B) of the Ohio Revised Code, the County Auditor is hereby requested to certify to this Board of Commissioners the total current tax valuation of the Belmont County Senior Citizens Levy and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the number of mills specified in Section 1 hereof, and the Clerk of this Board of Commissioners be and is hereby directed to certify forthwith a copy of this resolution to the County Auditor so that said County Auditor may certify such matters in accordance with such Section 5705.03.

Being part of a 40.556 acre tract of land and as described in Volume 548, Page 767 of the Belmont County Recorder's Office. (Parcel #32-60011.000)

Said lines and facilities shall be constructed within the limits of a thirty foot (30) wide strip of land lying fifteen (15) feet on each side of the facilities as constructed. The approximate location of said easement is depicted on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

This Easement conveys all necessary and convenient rights for the Easement's use, including, without limitation, the rights to: construct, operate, maintain, inspect, protect, repair, replace, enlarge, upgrade, extend and remove utility facilities and relocate within the Easement, all necessary and convenient facilities which include but are not limited to: poles, anchors, guys, supporting structures, conductors, conduits, enclosures, grounding systems, foundations, manholes, transformers, and associated equipment, adding thereto from time to time; perform grading or filling for such facilities; cut, trim, remove and/or otherwise control, with herbicides or by other means, at Grantee's option (without any liability to Grantor), any trees, limbs or branches, brush, shrubs, undergrowth, of whatever size, buildings, structures, or other obstructions that in Grantee's reasonable judgment endanger or interfere with the safety or use of its facilities, both within and adjoining the Easement. Within the Easement, Grantor shall not: place any structures, piles or debris, interfere with lateral support, change the level of the ground by excavation or mounding without Grantee's written consent, allow any construction that would be inconsistent with the National Electric Safety Code or Grantee's design standards, and, for underground lines, permit or cause any excavation, except for other utilities, provided such utilities rights do not conflict with this Easement. This Easement also conveys the right of ingress and egress in and over any reasonable routes at all times. If any governmental authority requires Grantee to relocate the facilities contemplated by this grant, this Easement conveys the right to relocate such facilities to a comparable location of Grantor's and Grantee's mutual agreement, without the need for a new easement.

#### TOURISM FUNDING REQUEST FOR BLACK HORSE INN, MORRISTOWN

10:30 Doc Householder, Executive Director, Belmont County Tourism and Pamela McCort, Vice-President, Morristown Historic Preservation Association

#### Re: Funding request-Black Horse Inn, Morristown

Mrs. Favede explained that Mr. Householder and Mrs. McCort were present regarding a funding request for the Black Horse Inn in Morristown and Belmont County Tourism has been asked to donate and is going to do so. Mr. Householder said the main reason the Tourism Council wants to help the Morristown committee is places like the Black Horse Inn are disappearing yearly. He said tour buses used to stop at the Black Horse Inn. The Morristown association is busy raising money to start repairs on the Inn. Once this is complete, they can put this on the list for tour operators and bus owners. Tourism believes this is a good investment. Mrs. McCort stated the Black Horse Inn is already on the National Register of Historic Places and already in the National Register of Historic Districts. A restored Black Horse Inn becomes part of the National Road experience here in Belmont County, which starts in Bridgeport, to the Blaine Bridge, comes to the former jail and Sheriff's Residence, the Great Western School, The Tavern and then the Black Horse Inn. She said it is known far and wide and she has traveled across the country and been asked if the Black Horse Inn is still in Morristown. There is a lot of interest state-wide in preserving this building from the Ohio National Road Association to the Ohio Historic Preservation Office. Private individuals have taken it as far as it can go. Now it needs to go to the next level. Last year Morristown did apply for Transportation Enhancement Program Funding. They have an architect's report from May, 2012, that states the Black Horse Inn is structurally sound and worthy of saving. They did not get funded because Congress passed a new transportation bill and they took acquisition of historic buildings out of it. Mrs. McCort further said there is a dedicated group of individuals in Morristown. They started raising money to purchase, but fell short. They still have those pledges. The first thing they have to do is mothball the building correctly and then actively seek other individuals and organizations, governments, etc., to take this building and restore it. This is a significant building on the National Road. She noted Doc Householder and Tourism have supported their efforts in the past in small ways. This is one of the largest projects they have ever done. She said thanks to the Tourism Council they were able to state-wide advertising regarding their Christmas Tour of Homes and pulled 500 visitors over the course of 8 hours and 2 days from Columbus, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Parma, Cuyahoga Falls, Marietta, Pennsylvania, Parkersburg, WV and other parts. They need a partnership. She concluded by giving thanks for this opportunity. Mrs. Favede stated this is one of many passions that she and Pamela share in preservation of historic buildings. Mrs. Favede said she always has been a promoter of preserving our history. She considers our historical buildings and our history in Belmont County to be one of our natural resources as important as anything else. Mrs. McCort noted a restored Black Horse Inn could become an Inn, a place to hold banquets and meetings like it used to be, a small place for cottage industry; they are looking at all options. It is community revitalization being in the heart of the historic district and can promote economic development.
